1. Who we are and what we do

Who we are

The Culture & Sport Service manages festivals and events throughout County Durham.

To deliver these requires the collection and use of personal data for the purposes of managing a box office and ticketing service for the event for the customer.

General access to the Food Festival is free however participation in some workshops and classes attract a charge and the purchase of a ticket is required to take part.

We also collect data from traders who will make an application to set up a stall at the event.

For the purposes of Data Protection, Durham County Council is the Data Controller.

What we do

Program, curate, and deliver Seaham and Bishop Auckland Food Festivals.

2. What type of personal information do we collect and how do we collect it?

What type of personal data will we collect

If you apply for tickets we will collect the following information

- your name
- address
- email address
- telephone number
- your bank details - to facilitate a financial transaction by debit or credit card.

If you are a trader we will collect the following information

- your name
- address
- email address and
- telephone number
- your bank details - to take a financial transaction by debit or credit card.

How we collect this information

- via the food festival website.

3. What is our power to obtain and use the personal data?

Lawful basis to process personal data is outlined in Article 6, of the General Data Processing Regulations:

Lawful Basis (Article 6)

Processing is necessary for the performance of a contract to which the data subject is party or in order to take steps at the request of the data subject prior to entering into a contract.

4. What is your personal information used for?

To take part in the food festival we require the collection and use of personal data in the following context.

- To issue you with a ticket to enable you to participate in food workshops and or classes.
- To approve your application to trade from a stall at the event - for Trader Applications we will share your information with Channell Events who are contracted by Durham County Council to contact you to agree terms with you to take part in the event.

5. Will your personal information be shared?

We will share your information where necessary to fulfil a legal requirement or within our legitimate interests such as for the prevention or detection of crime or for legal proceedings.

6. How do we keep your personal information secure?

The security of your personal information is important to us. This is why we have a range of security policies and procedures to control and safeguard access to and use of your personal information. This includes the use of passwords and encryption where appropriate to protect your financial information.

7. How long will we keep your personal information?

Our corporate retention guidelines show how long we keep information for different services.

We hold your personal information in relation to the services referenced in section 1 for a maximum period of two years after the event for the purposes of audit and compliance.

For financial details where you have transacted with our services we are obliged to retain information for a period not exceeding seven years from the date the data is captured.

8. Is your personal information processed outside the European Union (EU)?

We do not process your personal information outside the EU.

9. Marketing (if applicable)

At no time will your information be passed to organisations external to us and our partners for marketing or sales purposes or for any commercial use without your prior express

consent. We will only market our services to you if you have expressly given us consent to do so via a form or via the website when you made your transaction.

10. What are your Information Rights?

Your Information Rights are set out in the law. Subject to some legal exceptions, you have the right to:

- to have any inaccuracies corrected
- to have your personal data erased
- to place a restriction on our processing of your data
- to object to processing
- to request your data to be ported (data portability)
