Council Tax Summary 2019/20

Following extensive consultation and after considering the levels of Central Government funding for 2019/20, Ron Hogg, the Police, Crime and Victims' Commissioner, agreed his budget and set the precept (police element of the Council Tax) on 1st February 2019.

The following table indicates what the Council Tax increase will mean for households in County Durham and Darlington:

| Band G | £302.07 | £342.07 | £40.00 | £0.88 |
| Band H | £362.48 | £410.48 | £48.00 | £0.92 |

*55% of households in County Durham and Darlington are classed as Band A

** Nationally a typical Property is classed as Band D.
