#### **Portfolio Holder Statement**

As the Cabinet portfolio holder for Economy and Partnerships I am happy to say that the overview of the Area Action Partnerships falls under my remit.

Over the last 13 years AAPs have helped local community organisations to thrive through practical support and funding. 2022/23 has been no different. The 14 AAPs across County Durham have helped to fund over 230 projects through their Area Budgets allocating £2.6m to these good causes. This is making a massive difference when like the rest of us, local organisations are being adversely impacted by the continued long term impacts of the Covid pandemic and the cost of living crisis.

County Durham is a diverse place, and each AAP is led and directed by local people, councillors, and partners. This means they can adapt to local circumstances whether they be in Wingate or Westgate, Castleside or Coxhoe. This local engagement means AAPs are firmly rooted in, and valued by their communities.

Throughout County Durham AAP funding has supported a wide variety of projects including, youth work, mental health support, environmental projects, activities for older people, sports clubs, children's play, village halls and community centres, parish councils, community safety initiatives and employment schemes, just to name a few.

The AAPs also support myself and my fellow councillors in allocating our annual Neighbourhood Budget. The 126 County Councillors have allocated over £2.2m to over 820 local projects in County Durham over the past year, again supporting a wide range of local schemes.

As with any service, it is always good practice to consider if any improvements can be made. Having remained largely unchanged for the last 14 years, the need for an independent view as to how the service might be enhanced led to the recently completed community engagement review. While consultation is still ongoing on the proposals contained in the review, it comes as no surprise that the consultants found many strengths of the AAPs that we could build upon in the future.

None of this would be possible without the dedication of AAP Boards, fellow councillors, partner organisations, members of the public and the AAP staff. So, thank you one and all. The AAPs would not be the success they have been without your continued support.

Neighbourhood Budget is an allocation of £19,400 (£14,000 capital and £5,400 revenue) that each County Councillor receives year on year to support community projects. The funding process is supported by the AAP team.

In 2021/22 Councillors were centrally allocated £10,000 each from the Town & Villages Fund, which would form part of their NB allocation. This was allocated in the first year of term, to be used any time over their term of office. This allocation is separate to their main NB allocation and is dealt with by the Town & Villages Team.

### Aspire - 50 and Beyond

A women's only project, developed to provide women from the area with the opportunity to share experiences and support one another. Sessions were aimed at women over the age of 50 living in the Chester-le-Street AAP area and typically include a guest speaker and some gentle exercise, as well as an opportunity for information sharing and socialising. At least 30 women from the local area have received support through this project to date. This is one of five initiatives supported by the AAP this year to address social isolation, others include activities at Bullion Hall, Pelton, Sacriston and South Pelaw.



### Warm Packs

The AAP responded to the cost-of-living crisis by providing funding for warm packs containing items such as hot water bottles and blankets for those most in need during winter 2022/23. 480 warm packs were distributed via community venues across the AAP area, providing an important resource to those unable to heat their homes adequately during the winter months. This was one of several initiatives funded by the AAP during this year to help respond to the cost-of-living crisis, other projects included the provision of financial surgeries through NE First Credit Union to help mitigate against illegal money lending and providing support to Heaven's Kitchen based in Great Lumley to allow them to increase their capacity to respond to the growing demand for food provision in the local community.



### **Activity Week**

Activity Week is a free to participate, five-day event held in August during the summer holidays, delivered in partnership with Durham Constabulary. Activities such as climbing walls, face painting, bucking bronco and ping ball shooting ranges are all designed to build relationships between young people and agencies such as the Police and Fire & Rescue so they can convey important messages around crime and community safety. The event has recently received funding for an 11th year in 2023 and a 12th year in 2024. It is estimated that 10,000 people attended the event in 2022.
